Mathematics

Maths Makes Sense'

Arithmetic 1:

- Vertical additions with 2 digit whole numbers

Geometry:

- Make 2D shapes using dm sticks
- Be able to turn whole, half and quarter turns

Data and measure:

- Measure and record the length of a line in whole cm
- say and write mass in kg and g
- draw pictures to represent mass

Arithmetic 2:

- Copy, act and read division Maths Stories with 1-digit whole numbers

Reasoning:

- Use an addition or subtraction maths story to make up a real life story about everyday objects
- Draw pictures to act out a real life story
