#### **Dear Parents and Carers**

This half term has been short, but we have still been very busy with our learning here at Chesterfield. As you will see from this edition of our newsletter, we are working hard in class and we are also supporting children with their wider development through our extra-curricular activities, school visits and workshops. Year 4 recently enjoyed a visit to the National Gallery and were inspired to create their own artwork based on their favourite paintings. Year 1 went on a local area walk to support their learning in science, geography and RE and our Reception and Nursery children enjoyed learning about the animals when the farm visited our school.

We are proud of our Chesterfield values of Respect, Resilience and Responsibility and our children embody these in their learning and at playtimes. In addition, we have been exploring the value of Kindness and through stories, assemblies, acts of kindness and work in PSHE and circle time. ## Year 4 trip to the National Gallery

Our Year 4 pupils visited the National Gallery to support their learning about the artist Paul Cezanne. Children enjoyed a tour of the galleries and were able to recreate their favourite works of art. All the children really enjoyed the visit, with many saying it was the best school trip ever!









## **Sports Event at Lee Valley**

Students from year 3, 4, 5 and 6 took part in a range of sports including New Age Kurling, Boccia and Javelin at Lee Valley Athletics Centre. We were really proud of all of their efforts during the event—well done team!









#### **EYFS animal visit from Ark Farm**

Children in Nursery and Reception had some special visitors from the Ark Farm to link with their learning about animals. There were rabbits, guinea pigs, a tortoise and even a beautiful barn owl! The children got to meet all of the animals up close and evenfeed them! They really enjoyed learning about what they eat and how to look after them.











## Year 5 and 6 Learning in Design Technology

Year 5 children had to design and make a bird or insect house. They had to choose their own materials, measure, saw and secure the fittings. Then children had to weatherproof the structure so it was fit for purpose and evaluate their designs.













Year 6 worked with textiles—they had to learn different sewing techniques, evaluate them and choose the one they would use to sew their cushion. They chose their own measurements, materials and embellishments.

## Year 1 local area walk - science, geography and RE

Year 1 went on a local walk, we looked for minibeasts and birds as we have been learning about them in Science. We went to Albany Park and we saw lots of different types of birds in the wetlands area and on the field. Unfortunately we didn't find any minibeasts at this time of year but as we are fortunate enough to have an edible garden we did find lots of minibeasts when we got back to school. We have been learning about our local area in Geography and were set the challenge of finding our local shops, the closest church, the train station and of course our school on the return walk. In RE we have been learning about different religions, we stopped outside the Church and discussed some of the symbols we have found in books at school, The children found the symbol of the cross in lots of different places all over the church building.







#### Year 2 Art

Year 2 have been learning to mix a range of colours, shades and tones and match colours to objects, experimenting with painting techniques and adding texture to paint to create portraits of the late Queen.





#### **Lunar New Year**

Children in Reception created a Chinese dragon to celebrate this Lunar New Year and the start of the Year of the Dragon. The children visited all the other classes to share their work.

## My child is unwell, should I send them to school?

Sometimes it is difficult to know whether to keep your child off school or send them in. Always try and send your child to school if they are a little 'under the weather', for example, with a runny nose, headache, mild tummy-ache. The school will always contact you if your child is unwell, which is why it is vitally important that we have your correct contact details. HOWEVER, please do not send your child to school if they have any infectious illnesses like Chicken Pox, Measles etc. If your child has been vomiting or is suffering from diarrhoea, then they must stay away from school for 48 hours from the last bout of illness. This is to ensure that any infection does not spread through the school.
